EPA	Assess technical aspects of landfill works approval applications and cell approvals
	• Ensure works meet requirements of the Waste Management Policy and Siting, design, operation and rehabilitation of landfills (Landfill BEPM, publication 788)
	• Assess all emissions or discharges from the facility (other than lighting emissions) including energy and water use
	• Ensure works meet state environment protection policy (SEPP) requirements for N1 noise, air (odour, dust) and water (discharges) pollutants
	• Ensure works comply with the industrial waste management policy
	<ul> <li>Consider noise and amenity issues associated with activities at the site</li> </ul>
	• Provide guidance for buffer distances. If recommended buffer distances are not met – ensure measures are taken to mitigate concerns
	<ul> <li>Consider impacts on third parties like local residents and businesses</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Refuse to issue approval if it is contrary to policy or is likely to cause pollution</li> </ul>
	• Factor relevant works (as conditions) into the works approval that may be issued
