- 1. The land has what was once called an Industrial A zoning. The zoning allows, and is designed to cater for, manufacturing works of this type.
- In that light, COGG has no grounds to refuse the application, even though the works will generate noise and possible dust emissions close to residential North Shore.
- 3. The interests of North Shore Residents are most likely best served by seeking, as part of the permit, a commitment by Boral to robust and ongoing contact between Boral and North Shore Residents Group and the community it represents, such as already exists involving meetings of residents with the management of Incitec Pivot's fertiliser works and others, this process involving a watchdog role by EPA.
