

This information replaces the information regarding Class A reclaimed water quality in Section 4.4 and Table 1 of the *Guidelines for Environmental Management: Use of reclaimed water* (EPA publication 464.2).

Class A reclaimed water schemes can generally be described as those that have high potential for direct human contact with reclaimed or recycled water that has been derived from municipal sewerage facilities.

The Class A water quality objectives described in Section 4.4 and Table 1 of publication 464.2 are **not deemed appropriate** for the protection of human health. Instead, the following guidance should be referred to for identifying water quality objectives for Class A schemes:

- For residential dual-pipe schemes, refer to the *Guidelines for Environmental Management: Dual pipe water recycling schemes* (EPA publication 1015).
- For other uses, refer to the Australian Guidelines for Water Recycling: Managing Health and Environmental Risks (Phase 1) (NRMMC, EPHC and AHMC 2006) (available from www.ephc.gov.au)
